2.0	Minutes of the previous meeting were read and after minor amendments, will be adjusted and archived by NP	NP
3.0	Matters Arising -(follow up from previous meeting and minutes, points in brackets refer to sections on previous minutes) (4.1) the proposed cost of Field Mycology, check price with Elsevier and apply a	
	staged increase of the price to members from 2011, to eventually reach full price. (4.5) after some investigation it appears that pursuing Thread Creative, previous website builders, to recoup funds will not be viable. The cost of legal support would be greater than the possible monies reclaimed. CH asked again if the small claims	
	court might be a way of pursuing redress. LB asked if all present concurred that BMS was unlikely to be able to recoup any monies, that all the BMS can do is to use what useful resources were available from this unsatisfactory venture, and move on with the current website development. All	
	reluctantly agreed to this (4.2) Geoff Robson has accepted the nomination to stand as BMS president in 2013.	
	LB has discussed a 'day-rate' for attending IMC9 with the organizers Elsevier. This has now been agreed upon and an announcement will be going out soon through the usual channels.	
	(4.4) Prof Nick Read will receive the Benefactors Medal for 2010. Prof John Webster will receive the Presidents Award at IMC9, but unfortunately cannot travel to Edinburgh to receive it in person due to personal circumstances. PK suggested using a live 'link-up' to allow John Webster to be seen to receive the award.	
	(12.0) The Thailand Workshop Lecture Series -this was cancelled due to the Unrest currently taking place in Thailand. These have been rearranged for the start of November 2010 provisionally.	
4.0	The President - LB informed those present of the death of Prof C.T.Ingold at the age of 104 years old. An obituary has appeared in 'Nature' journal. The BMS has been offered an opportunity to publish an autobiography supplied by Prof Ingold from his papers. 4.1	contact SS about a picture and print copy for the newsletter. Website - SS gave a visual demonstration of the look of the new website in development with Souk. The front page slide 'Welcome to the BMS' was shown with the links to the sections assigned to the three new committees. Copyright issues to use the created imagery have been resolved satisfactorily. LB, SS, and Ali Ashby of FEO have reviewed and approved page design. In mid May Souk wanted to do the back-end work, ready for the start of June but staffing issues delayed this. The website delivery schedule was revised accordingly. SS demonstrated the site as it stood, specifically the top line menus linking to the new sections FBR, FEO and FMC. Images are required to populate the visual elements of the site. NR suggested using images from the book produced for the exhibition at Royal Botanic Gardens Edinburgh (RBGE). DM asked if conservation could be made more prominent throughout the site. FD asked if it could be ensured that the section tabs on the front page mirrored the new section names, e.g.; Fungal Biology Research and not Fungal Science, Field Mycology and Conservation, not Field Mycology. A discussion ensued about what was changeable within the site and what was fixed.	NP
	It was decided to send the images around council for feedback over the weekend of 25th to the 27th of June.	
	LB thanked SS for the all his hard work on bringing the new website together.	
4.2	Subscription Charges - it was proposed that a 5% increase be applied to 2010 prices for 2011. LB asked those present what should members be charged, to either simply cover costs or add to the membership costs to provide some income to the Society. The cost of most journals set by Elsevier had increased by about 5%, but charging the realistic cost for Field Mycology would be a huge leap from 2010. In 2010 it was £15 but in 2011 the Society would have to pay Elsevier £26.50. A price halfway between these two would be better received by the membership, whilst taking less BMS funds in subsidy. Fungal Biology Reviews was also subsidised last year and will also need to increase in 2011. DG asked what does the BMS provide to the subscribers to Field Mycology? If it is only the journal at a reduced rate then why will they stay with the BMS? Members have reduced rates at forays, the Newsletter and access to the BMS website and all the information therein. DM suggested placing greater emphasis on the less tangible benefits such as contributing to conservation and protection of the environment. A vote was called for as to whether to increase the cost of Field Mycology to the membership to the amount of either £22 or £25 in print and £20 when taken with eaccess. A show of hands was asked for to agree the price of hard copy alone. £22 in print (5 in favor)

	discussed. The new structure as agreed at SGM was outlined and the composite	

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	members identified. This included the methods of election to council and committee, and the terms to be served.	
	A BMS member from India has contacted the office and asked if he could nominate	
	himself to one of the new committees. It is not possible according to the Constitution	
	to self nominate, and he has not been supported to-date by two other members. It	
	raised the question of how far the BMS can go to cover the cost of active	
	participation in BMS meetings.	
	A limit of £250 was proposed as the maximum amount allowed for travel/attendance	
	costs normally, with exceptional cases considered on their individual merit. All	
	present agreed on this.	
	Council structure in future willbe only 13 members under the new constitution.	
	Currently there are more than 13 trustees elected to Council, but in telephone	
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	conversations with the Charities Commission earlier this year, they indicated that trustees could resign or remain as trustees until their term of office was completed.	
	LB asked all present to consider this state of affairs and reflect on how best to move towards the council structure indicated in the new constitution.	
	Dinah Griffin spoke up at this point indicating she had approached LB before this	
	meeting with an offer to resign from Council. SA and FD applauded this move and reminded all present that the membership have approved the smaller composition of	
	Council, and current numbers exceed this. SA and FD offered to step down to help	
	reduce numbers.	
	LB reminded all that the new committees plan most of their own outgoings/spending	
	commitments but Council will still need to approve these plans and other financial	
	commitments.
